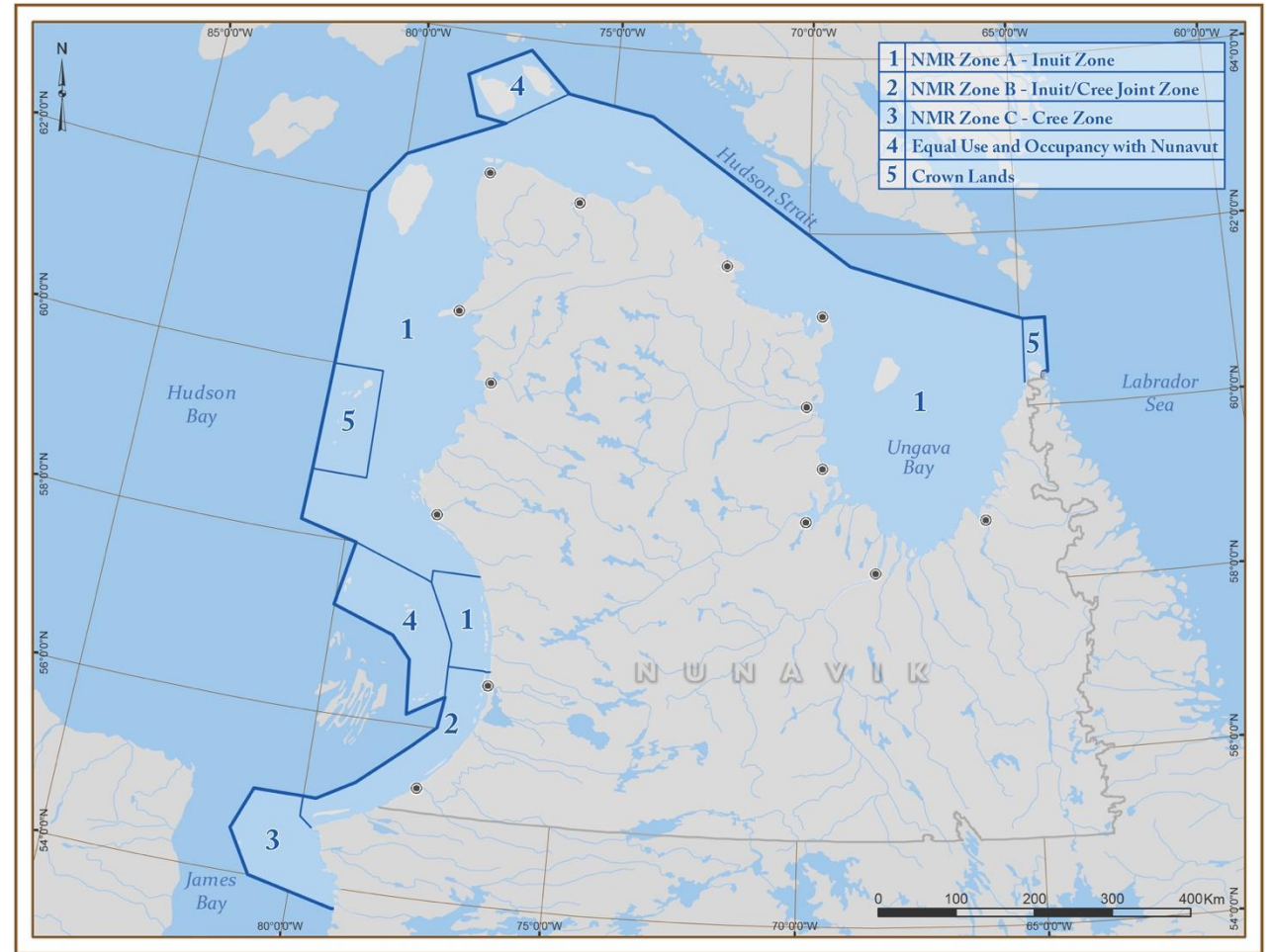
Who is the Nunavik Marine Region Planning Commission?



- Created under the Nunavik Inuit Land Claims Agreement
- Established as an institution of public government
 - Government of Canada
 - Government of Nunavut
 - Makivvik

Where does the Nunavik Marine Region Planning Commission work?

- Nunavik Marine Region (saltwater and islands off Nunavik)
- Located within the jurisdictions of the Governments of Nunavut and Canada
- Contains areas of shared ownership and responsibility



What does the Nunavik Marine Region Planning Commission do?

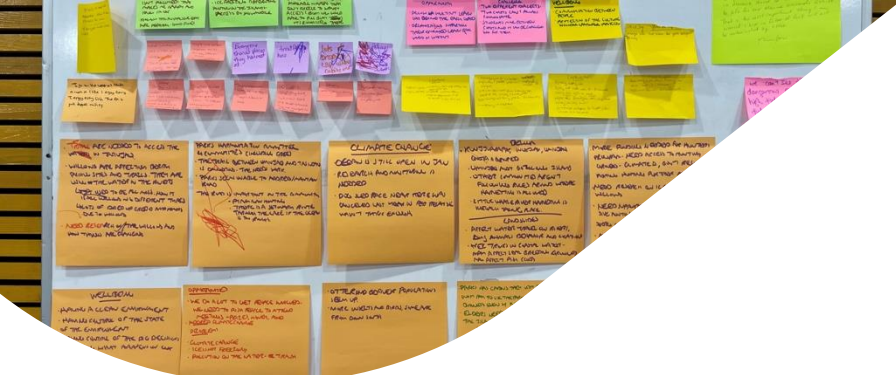
- Reviews projects for impact review screening
(Gatekeeper of the Nunavik Marine Region)
- Conducts marine planning





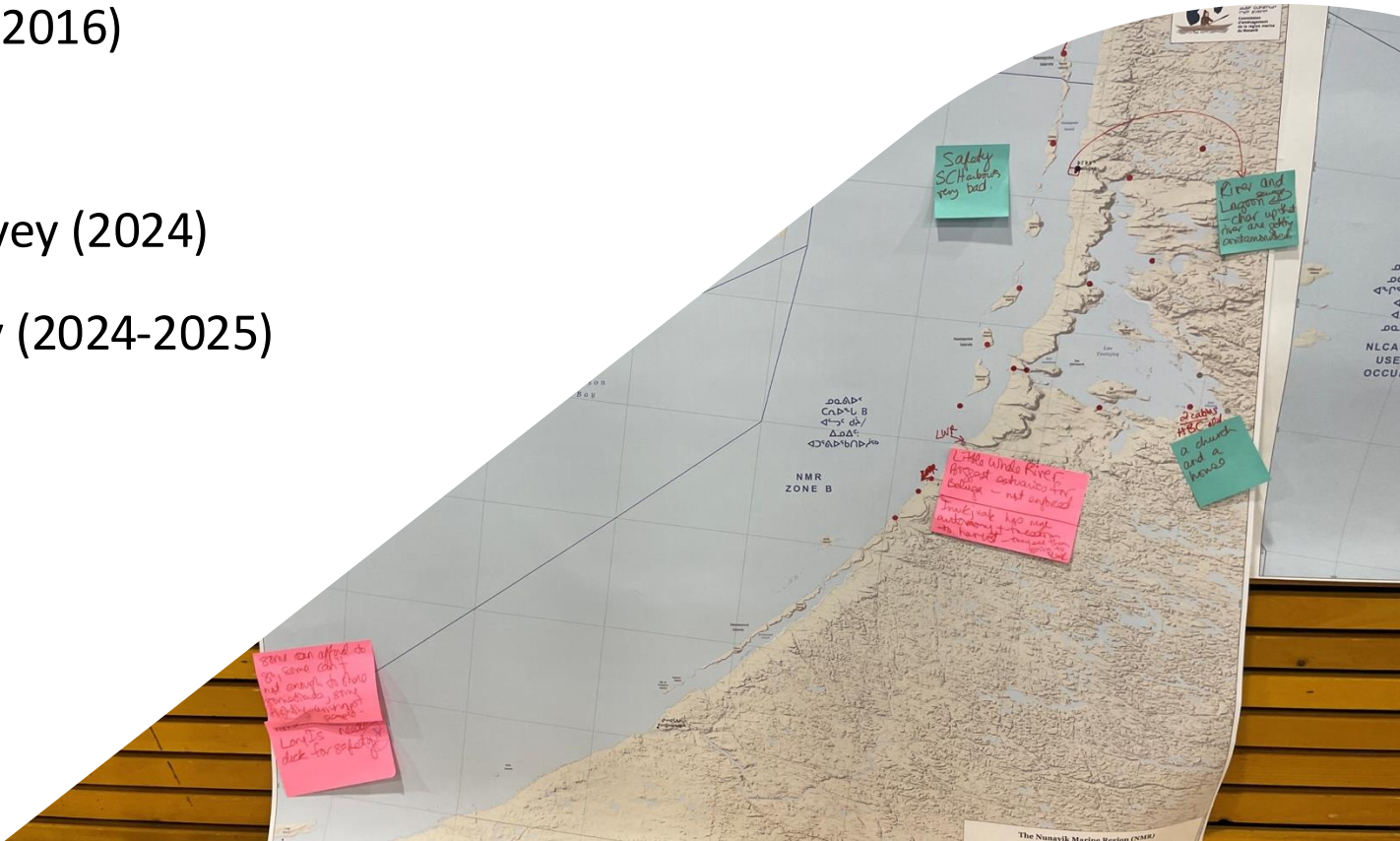
What is marine planning?

- Process for managing ocean spaces
- Brings planning partners together to establish and work towards social, cultural, environmental, and economic objectives
- Does **NOT** replace existing management
- Provides benefits
 - Minimize conflicts
 - Protect culture and the environment
 - Advance the right development and economic activities
- Leads to development of a Marine Use Plan (includes development of a Marine Planning Strategy)

Objectives and Actions (examples)

Katujjiqatigiinniq: Integrity and Inclusion

Objective: Ensure work is open and transparent to promote confidence in the marine planning process
